	 Administration 2 individuals did not pass the FA course. Need to advise National ASAP as Zone Completion List was already submitted.

	 Education 5 or 6 individuals did not pass the on-snow. Executive consensus reached during the meeting that these individuals are not to attend the hill ski-around days as they have not completed the new patroller course. Jean to reach out to James and Chris to ensure that they contact these individuals to advise them not to attend the ski-around days and to encourage them to participate in the ski improvement clinics. Additional support will be dedicated to these individuals to ensure successful completion of the on-snow and for retention. Calgary Zone to consider re-configuring the method of delivery for the new patroller course to ensure

	 Marielle raised concern about potential for openings at hills filling up and not matching candidate's expressed interest as notification dates to candidates are different for the hills. This concern was echoed in Chris' report where he expressed concerns that patrollers will be placed at a hill that wasn't their first choice and would become short-timer. Marielle raised question: Should Calgary Zone continue to actively recruit snowboarders as there are becoming few opportunities to place them? Executive discussed and agreed to direct Recruitment that Calgary Zone will no longer be accepting snowboarders unless they have been pre-cleared by a hill PL before enrolling in the new patroller course.
